LAST MONTH'S MEETING

Our speaker David Meara was
Rector of St Bride's Church, Fleet St,
London for 15 years from the year 2000.
St Bride's is warm and welcoming, and
one of the most famous and most
fascinating historic churches in central
London, it is known worldwide as the



journalist church, offering a spiritual home to all. The church is justly world famous. To enter its doors is to step into 2,000 years of history. The great fire of 1666 left the church in ruins. It was to take nine years for St Bride's to reappear from the ashes under the inspired direction of Christopher Wren. It has an unmistakable wedding cake spire. It was as a result of many clergy living in the area and there need for printing literature and books, that it became an ideal place for the many newspapers to base themselves

During the 50's, 60' and 70's, Fleet St had its heyday, it was buzzing. There was a culture amongst the journalists to do whatever it takes to get the story to print. Hacking was rife and there was certainly a lot of unruly behaviour. The church was right in the heart of this newspaper area and held many services to serve the newspaper workers.

In the 1980s, the newspaper businesses started to leave the street, opting for electronic printing operations in Wapping. The last journalists left Fleet Street in 2016, when the Dundee-based Sunday Post closed its London office

A great effort has gone into building a stronger relationship with the royal family. They include St Bride's holding an annual journalists' service to remember all journalists who have died.

Queen Camilla is Patron of the Guild of St Bride's.



Today, sadly, newspapers are in sharp decline as people access news in so many other ways but St Bride's church is still regarded as the spiritual home of the press.
