

### LAST MONTH'S MEETING

Our speaker for the evening was Andy Mills who is the head gardener at Blenheim Palace. Andy joined Blenheim in 2022 and began by telling us of his previous experience at various National Trust properties.

Using slides, he gave us a tour of the gardens. In particular he showed us pictures of how various areas of the gardens used to be, and how work is now under way to either change them back to their original state or to improve the look. Some of the work, especially the reshaping of the hedges will take up to 10 yrs to complete. In the rosarium the existing roses have been removed and replaced by beautiful perfumed varieties. No chemicals are used and greenfly are washed off by soapy water. Andy has some major projects on the go and he plans to give each area of the gardens the "wow" factor.

70,000 daffodils have already been planted with another 70,000 this year.

### **GROUP MEETING**

Six of our members attended the group meeting at Begbroke Village Hall. It was a good meeting and Caroline was given a gift for her work on the committee. The speaker was Brian Kay a well-known English radio presenter, conductor and singer. He was well-known as the bass in the King's Singers during the group's formative years from 1968 to 1982.
