LAST MONTH'S MEETING

Gary Collins, himself an architect and Chair of the Turn End Trust, gave a most interesting talk entitled *Turn End*. This title referred to name of one of three village houses viz The Turn, Turn and Turn End in Haddenham, Buckinghamshire. They were designed by architect Peter Aldington in the 1960's. Peter and his wife Margaret were responsible for much of the building work themselves for which they received a Royal Institute of British Architects Award for Architecture in 1970. The immense detail in each house has been responsible for the many visits by architects/ visitors from all over the world.

On 15th July 1998 the three buildings were added to the list of buildings of special architectural or historic interest. This was upgraded to Grade 11^{*} in 2006, one of only a handful of post war houses at this grade.

Jackie Hunt, Gardener at Turn End', told us all about the gardens which were designed and made by Peter as a natural extension to the house and have developed with the buildings, maturing into an internationally renowned garden, gaining publicity through television programmes, and the many articles that have been written about it. In less than an acre, space is used to create an illusion of size - courtyards with pools, a small woodland around old apple trees, a curved glade leading to a series of garden rooms – sunken or raised, sunny or shady, geometric or informal.





The Aldingtons still live at Turn End. Middle Turn is privately owned and occupied, while The Turn is currently let.
